In 2012 we producing and hosting readings, performances, book launches and tours of UK-based writers, we will be bringing writers from overseas - US, Caribbean and Europe - to meet and engage with audiences and venues, and we are running Creative Salons in different cities which offer skills sharing, conversation and useful insights and contacts for practitioners and writers at all levels. The salon is aimed at the broad spectrum of people who work in literature and the artists - whether writers, producers, publishers, students, performers, speakers or up-and-coming talent.
